Dear Athletic Director Burke,

Pursuant to the state open records law, 5 III. Comp. Stat. 140/1 to 140/11.5, I write to request access to and a copy of the athletic squad list for each Eastern Illinois University Intercollegiate Athletics Team.

Please note the recent decision concerning the University of North Carolina, Chapel Hill (The News and Observer Publishing Company, et al. versus Richard A. Baddour, Director of Athletics for the University of North Carolina, et al. 10CVS1941 Orange County Superior Court) where the court's holding confirmed that FERPA does not protect the names of recipients of athletic scholarships from open records requests.

- (1) Specifically, I request the information commonly stored in CAi detailing the team and names of all Eastern Illinois "counters" for the 2011-2012 academic year per NCAA Bylaw 15.02.3.
- (2) Additionally, I request the team and names of all Eastern Illinois "initial counters" for the 2011-2012 academic year per NCAA Bylaw 15.02.3.1.
- (3) Lastly, I request a copy of each intercollegiate teams' "squad list" for the 2011-2012 school year, who's maintenance is required by NCAA Bylaws 15.5.11 and 15.5.11.1.

In regards to the each team's squad list, I specifically request:

A. Identification and Status

1a. The names of each student-athlete on each team, including each squad member and other student-athletes who do not compete but receive aid that must be counted (for example, student-athletes who are red-shirted, those fulfilling a transfer residence requirement or those who qualify for a hardship waiver) for the 2011-2012 academic year.

B. Eligibility

1b. The eligibility status of each student-athlete for each term they attended Eastern Illinois.

C. Status of Student

- Ic. The term each student-athlete first enrolled at ANY institution.
- 2c. The term each student-athlete first enrolled at Eastern Illinois.
- 3c. The number of years (and the specific years) each student-athlete has received financial aid (not including the current year).
- 4c. The number of seasons (and the specific seasons) of eligibility each student-athlete has used (not including current year).
- 5c. Whether each student-athlete was recruited or was not recruited.

D. Financial Aid Information

- 1d. The period of award for which each student-athlete received athletic aid.
- 2d. The amount of athletics grant each student-athlete received for each period of award.
- 3d. The amount of other aid each student-athlete received that counts against institutional limits for the 2011-2012 academic year.
- 4d. The amount of total countable aid for each student-athlete for the 2011-2012 academic year.

E. Countable Players

- *Ie.* The full athletic grant in aid amount of each team during the 2011-2012 academic year.
- 2e. For equivalency sports, the equivalency total of athletic grant in aid for the 2011-2012 academic year.
- 3e. The list of student-athletes who's aid is exempt from the overall (and initial in football) scholarship limitations for 2011-2012.
- 4e. The list of student-athletes who's aid counts against the overall (and initial in football) scholarship limitations for 2011-2012.

F. Change in Status

- *If.* The list of all student-athletes currently "active" on each squad list for 2011-2012.
- 2f. If a student-athlete is listed on the 2011-2012 squad list but is no longer active, the reason for the change in status (i.e., cut/dismissed from team "C"; exhausted eligibility in sport "E"; graduated "G"; medical exception resulting from a career-ending injury/condition "M"; or quit "Q").

G. Revenue Distribution

Ig. The list of each team and each student-athlete's automatically generated equivalency-award values for revenue distribution purposes that are used for NCAA reports, surveys, ect. for the 2011-2012 academic year (this equivalency

figure is different from the equivalency numbers requested above because it is the ratio of athletics aid (not the total countable aid) the student-athlete receives compared to the maximum amount that could be awarded (the total cost for tuition and fees, room, board, and books).

I agree to pay any reasonable copying and postage fees of not more than \$2.00. If the cost would be greater than this amount, please notify me. Please provide a receipt indicating the charges for each document.

As provided by the open records law, I will expect your response within five (5) working days. See 5 Ill. Comp. Stat. 140/3(c).

If you choose to deny this request, please identify which provision of this request you are denying, and provide a written explanation for the denial including a reference to the specific statutory exemption(s) upon which you rely. Also, please provide all segregable portions of otherwise exempt material.

Please be advised that I am prepared to pursue whatever legal remedy necessary to obtain access to the requested records. I would note that willful violation of the open records law can result in the award of reasonable attorney' fees. See 5 III. Comp. Stat. 140/11(i).
